Concord’s January 2022 Special Town Meeting was called to order in the gymnasium, cafeteria, auditorium and parking lot of the Concord Carlisle High School at 7:00 pm on Thursday, January 20, 2022 to take up one article. A total of 517 voters checked in. (102 were checked in at their cars and participated from the parking lot).The result of town meeting action is listed below. Special Town Meeting dissolved at 8:02 pm on Monday evening having concluded its legislative business.

- ✓ After Friday the 28th, you can still vote absentee in person at the Town Clerk’s Office 12 noon on Wednesday, February 2, 2022.
- ✓ Absentee ballots must be returned to the Town Clerk’s Office by 8:00pm on February 2nd to be counted.

- ✓ Polls are open from 7:00am – 8:00pm
