FLOWERING CRABAPPLE – SMALL

Scientific name: Malus spp.
Cultivar: disease resistant only

Rounded shape with a spread of 15-25ft. Produces flowers in Spring, followed by crabapples. Full sun/partial shade.

JAPANESE LILAC TREE – SMALL

Scientific name: Syringa reticulata
Cultivar: depends on availability

Oval to rounded crown with a spread of 15-25ft. Produces white flowers in spring, has insufficient fall color. Full sun.

CHERRY - SMALL

Scientific name: Prunus spp.
Cultivar: various

Typically has pink flowers, sometimes white. Leaves turn yellow in the fall. Full sun/part shade.

GREEN HAWTHORN - MEDIUM

Scientific name: Crataegus viridis
Cultivar: 'Winter King'

Has a rounded structure with a 20-30 ft spread. White flowers in spring produce bright red fruit. Has thorns. Fall foliage turns purple to red hues. Full sun.

SARGENT CHERRY - MEDIUM

Scientific name: Prunus sargentii
Cultivar: depends on availability

Pink flowers in spring, with shiny reddish-brown bark. Purplish-red leaves in the fall. Canopy is 20-30 ft once mature. Full sun/partial shade.

KATSURATREE - LARGE

Scientific name: Cercidiphyllum japonicum
Cultivar: depends on availability

Variable spread up to 40-60ft wide. Beautiful shape, nice foliage. Leaves turn yellow in fall. Full sun/partial shade.

AMERICAN SWEETGUM - LARGE

Scientific name: Liquidambar styraciflua
Cultivar: 'Happidaze'

Typically fruitless, which is good for an urban setting. Canopy width of 40-60ft. Maroon color in fall. Full sun.

TULIPTREE - LARGE

Scientific name: Liriodendron tulipifera
Cultivar: 'Arnold'

Crown is upright and pyramidal, good for narrow spaces. Usual spread is 15-20ft. Yellow flowers in Spring. Full sun/partial shade.

DOWNY SERVICEBERRY - SMALL

Scientific name: Amelanchier x grandiflora
Cultivar: 'Autumn Brilliance'

Grown as a small tree or large shrub, rounded shape. Spread near 15-25 ft. White flowers in spring, leaves in fall. Fruit similar to blueberries. Leaves turn red or orange in fall. Full sun/part shade.

KOUSA DOGWOOD - SMALL

Scientific name: Cornus kousa
Cultivar: numerous exist

Starts as vase-shaped and rounds with age. Canopy spread is 15-30ft. White flowers in Spring, bark is multi-colored gray, tan, and brown. Full sun/part shade.

THORNLESS HONEYLOCUST - MEDIUM

Scientific name: Gleditsia triacanthos inermis
Cultivar: 'Skyline'

Typically grows to 40-45ft. Is nearly seedless, with yellow leaves in fall. Prefers full to partial sun.

BLACK TUPELO - MEDIUM

Scientific name: Nyssa sylvatica
Cultivar: depends on availability

Pyramidal rounded form, spread up to 30ft. Beautiful fall leaves can be orange, yellow, and red. Full sun/partial shade

LONDON PLANETREE - LARGE

Scientific name: Platanus x acerifolia
Cultivar: 'Bloodgood'

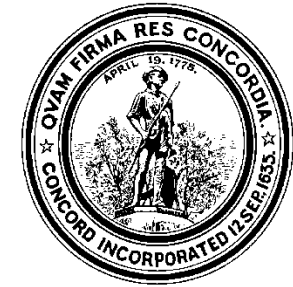

Requires large growth-space. Good street tree with strong limbs. Known for its beautiful olive color peeling bark. Canopy spread of rounded crown is 65-80ft. Full sun.
